MORTON COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

The deadline for submitting the 2019-2020 Scholarship Application Package is March 5, 2019.

Morton College and the Morton College Foundation sponsor and provide funding in the form of scholarships, grants, and awards listed in this booklet.

The Morton College Foundation relies on the generosity of alumni, faculty, staff, private individuals, businesses, communities, and benevolent organizations for sustained financial support.

Student financial assistance covers approved educational costs such as tuition, fees, books, and other expenses as directed by each donor. The award amounts represent the maximum monetary value to be awarded during the Fall and Spring semesters during the academic year. Students are responsible to meet the fund's eligibility criteria in order to receive financial support.

The Morton College Financial Aid Scholarship Committee selects the recipient(s). <u>Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee that an applicant will receive an award.</u> Morton College and the Morton College Foundation reserve the right to suspend the presenting of an award.

Descriptions of individual scholarship requirements are listed in the following pages. To qualify for one or more of these scholarships, please submit the application at the end of the packet along with any other required information to the Financial Aid Office.

- The deadline for the 2019-2020 scholarship application package is March 5, 2019. <u>Absolutely no late</u> application packages will be accepted.
- All scholarship recipients are required to attend the Scholarship Convocation Ceremony on May 3, 2019.
- With the exception of specific transfer scholarships, the scholarships listed in this booklet are for students attending Morton College for the 2019-2020 school year.
- All students are eligible to apply for Morton College Foundation and Morton College scholarships regardless of immigration status.

APPLICATION PROCESS

THE SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION PACKAGE DEADLINE IS MARCH 5, 2019. SUBMIT APPLICATION ALONG WITH ALL REQUIRED DOCUMENTS TO THE FINANCIAL AID OFFICE AT MORTON COLLEGE ROOM 205B. ALL SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS WILL BE NOTIFIED BY APRIL 5, 2019.

All applicants must submit the following items:

- An electronic 2019-2020 FAFSA at www.fafsa.ed.gov and include Morton College school code 001728.
- FAFSA completion confirmation page.
- Official high school or college transcript(s). If the applicant has never attended college, submit high school transcript only.
- Two typed and signed letters of recommendation from individuals (other than family) who know the applicant well (i.e., teacher, supervisor).
- Narrative statement from the applicant describing their academic and career goals, and past experiences
 that have helped shape their character. Guidelines: one-page minimum to two-pages maximum, singlespaced, 12pt Arial font, 1 inch margin on all sides, include your name and ID #.
- Complete and Submit Morton College Scholarship Application found on page 7 of this booklet.
- · Some scholarships may require an additional statement.

*** Incomplete application packages will not be considered for review.***

- Attach a personal narrative of about 500 words (no more than 2 pages double spaced using 12 point font) describing an obstacle or struggle you have faced in your life and how you have found the hope to overcome it

- Enroll in an Associates Degree program at Morton College
