I. Complete the general education requirements distributed as follows:

A. Communications - 9 semester hours

ENG 101, ENG 102, and SPE 101 are required.

A minimum grade of "C" must be earned in ENG 101 and 102. See note on reverse side*

B. Behavioral Science/Social Sciences - 6 semester hours with courses selected **from two disciplines**. Any courses from: **ANT** 101,102*; **ECO** 101,102; **GEG** 105*, 115*,125*; **HIS** 105, 106,

180; **POL** 201, 202; **PSY** 101, 201, 210, 211, 215; **SOC** 100, 101, 102, 201*; **SSC** 140

C. Mathematics - 4 semester hours

Choose one course from: MAT 102, 121, 124, 141, 181, 201, 202, 203, 224.

D. Science - 7 semester hours with one course selected from the life sciences and one course

from the physical sciences to include one laboratory course.

Choose one course from: **BIO** 100, 102L, 110L, 140, 150, 160, 161L, 202.

Choose one course from: CHM 105L; GEG 101; GEL 101L; PHS 101, 103L; PHY 101L.

E. Humanities - 6 semester hours from:

ART 127 required.

And one course from **ENG** 211, 215, 216, 218, 220, 221, 225; **HIS** 103, 104; **HUM** 150, 151,154*;

PHI 125*, 126, 180, 201, 202; **SPN** 202, 215, 216, 220, 225, 226.

II. Complete 30 semester hours of major area requirements and elective courses distributed as follows:

A. Major Area Required Courses - 21 semester hours.

Complete **ART** 101, 102, 103, 104, 125, 126, and 203.

B. Elective Studio Art Courses - 9 semester hours. Choose three studio art courses in consultation with an art department advisor: ART 105, ART 111, ART 113, ART 115, ART 116, ART 205, ART 211, ART 213.

III. Satisfy the other graduation requirements for your degree as stated in the Morton College catalog.

Since completion of the Associate in Fine Arts in Art curriculum does not fulfill the requirements of the Illinois General Education Core Curriculum, students will need to complete the general education requirements of the institution to which they transfer. However, if students take an additional social/behavioral science course in addition to the one stated above, they will have met the Illinois Articulation Initiative General Education core curriculum. Students who know their specific field of study and which university they plan to transfer should follow the specific course recommendations of that university.
